UPDATE FROM OUR GENERAL MANAGER, HELEN CONNELLY

Looking back on 2025, I can honestly say it has been the busiest year in my time as General Manager here at Thornberry Animal Sanctuary. Over the past twelve months, we've rehomed over 1,300 animals, ranging from hamsters to horses, and everything in between. Each animal leaving our care for a new home is a reminder of why we do what we do, and it's only possible thanks to the dedication of our team and the incredible support of our community.

It has also been a year of growth and change. In January, we gave our Todwick Road charity shop a full revamp, including new flooring, lights and shop fittings, helping us continue to raise vital funds for the sanctuary. This was made possible thanks to a generous donation from one of our long-time supporters, Roy Howe, whose late wife, Ann, was a true lover of charity shops and spent many happy hours at Thornberry browsing our shops.

Later in the year, in August, we opened a new charity shop in Retford, which has been met with real positivity. Both the Rotherham and Retford shops now sell second-hand, good-quality furniture, and to make this possible, we invested in a Luton van to help transport items and deliver locally. It's a small step that has made a big difference. This brings us to five charity shops, all of which play a huge part in supporting the charity financially.

Events have also been a highlight, though the weather hasn't always been on our side. From rainy days to unpredictable storms, our supporters have turned out time and time again, and I want to say a heartfelt thank you to everyone who joined us—your support makes all the difference.

This year has also brought new members to the Thornberry family. Ana, our resident vet, welcomed baby Mathilda, and Keeley, our Head of Projects, welcomed baby Amelia. Their arrivals have reminded us of the joy and renewal that life continually brings, even amidst a busy and sometimes challenging environment.



Operationally, we've faced our share of challenges. Our additional buildings and resources meant we needed to increase our electricity supply to meet demand; this has been expensive but necessary. On the farm, drainage issues have caused some difficulties, and we even had to call in the Fire Brigade to help lift our old boy Flash after he got stuck in the mud while rolling. Sadly, at the grand age of 33 years old, we had to let Flash go shortly after, a poignant reminder that in animal welfare, sometimes the hardest decisions are also the most compassionate.

Perhaps the biggest highlight of the year has been our new Cattery extension, which added seven additional pens and four dedicated holding pods, particularly useful for animals recovering from operations. This has made a direct impact, and this year I am proud to announce we have rehomed almost 600 cats and kittens (in 2024 rehoming 401) a truly remarkable achievement. The demand for our services continues to grow, and it is our commitment to help as many homeless animals as possible.

Working in animal welfare is as rewarding as it is emotional. Boxing Day brought this home to me in a very real way. I spent over an hour in the emergency vet waiting room waiting to pick up one of our puppies that became really unwell on Christmas Day and I witnessed first hand families coming and going, their faces full of tears—of joy, relief, and heartbreak. It reminded me that the bond between people and animals is profound, and that every member of our team carries a huge emotional commitment to the animals in our care.



Reflecting on 2025, I feel immense pride and gratitude. Every animal rehomed, every life touched, and every moment of care is possible because of our dedicated team, our volunteers, and the community that supports us. Thank you for being part of the Thornberry family, helping us make a difference every day—one life at a time.

UPDATE FROM OUR ON-SITE VET TEAM

Caring for Our Animals Inside and Out

Our veterinary team works tirelessly to ensure every animal receives the care they need. From routine check-ups to surgeries and dental care, the team plays a vital role in keeping our animals healthy, comfortable, and pain-free. Being able to carry out so much of this work on-site has been a huge advantage for the sanctuary, reducing costs and allowing more animals to benefit from improved welfare.

In spring 2025, Ana, our resident vet, passed the baton to Gemma as she began her maternity leave. Gemma joined the vet team bringing skill, experience, and infectious enthusiasm, and over the past year has added another string to her bow by developing her expertise in BOAS surgery — specialist training funded by the sanctuary. This delicate procedure supports short-nosed breeds such as Pugs, French Bulldogs, and English Bulldogs, helping them breathe more easily — an increasingly important need as rescue centers see more of these breeds each year. It's a great example of how our team continually builds its skills to provide the very best care.



Alongside Gemma is Beth, our dedicated vet nurse, who assists during procedures and keeps the vet room running smoothly.

Laura, our Cattery Manager and a qualified Registered Veterinary Nurse, also lends her expertise in the Vet Room each Friday. Together, the team ensures every animal receives the attention and care they deserve. Meanwhile, Ana is enjoying time with her new baby, Mathilda, and we look forward to welcoming her back to Thornberry later this year.

Our in-house vet team is kept fully occupied caring for domestic animals, including dogs, cats, rabbits, and other small mammals. Being able to perform procedures such as dentals, eye removals, amputations, and BOAS surgery on-site has been hugely beneficial. Dental care in particular is essential — untreated dental disease can lead to pain, infection, and more serious health issues — and carrying out these procedures at the sanctuary reduces stress for the animals while also saving significant costs.



Even serious cases are treated on-site whenever possible. Recently, Bagel was involved in a road traffic accident and arrived at Thornberry with a leg broken in two places. Gemma was able to perform the amputation here at the sanctuary, allowing Bagel to recover safely in familiar surroundings.

Some procedures, however, are beyond what we can currently provide in-house. Complex orthopaedic surgeries, advanced diagnostics such as CT or MRI scans, and cases requiring overnight hospitalisation must be referred to specialist clinics. Likewise, all veterinary care for our farm animals and equines must be outsourced, as larger animals require specialist vets and equipment. Access to trusted referral partners ensures these animals still receive the expert care they need.

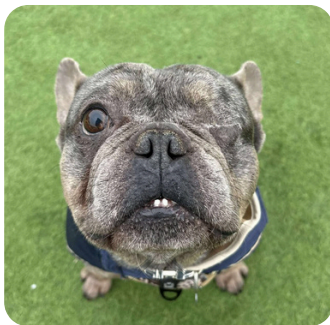

UPDATE FROM THE KENNELS TEAM

A Year in Review: 2025 at the Kennels

2025 was an incredibly busy and rewarding year for us in the kennels, with 360 dogs finding their way into new, loving homes. We rehomed more behavioural challenging dogs than ever before, including our three longest-term residents — Pluto, Albus and Whiskey.

As always, my heartfelt thanks go to our dedicated and hardworking team, who consistently go above and beyond for the animals in our care: Colm, Hannah, Sophie, Michael and Josefine. This year, I was delighted to welcome Josefine to the team after she spent several months volunteering with us at both Todwick Road and our Farm in Ravenfield.

There were also plenty of personal milestones to celebrate — Sophie married her now husband James, Colm passed his driving test, and Hannah welcomed another four-legged addition to her family with the arrival of a Thornberry puppy, Dash.



My family and I were kept busy with 24 foster animals this year, including supporting a dog who gave birth to puppies in our living room, and caring for a kitten just 24 hours old. Our Volunteer Team continued to grow, which has helped us increase our capacity to help even more dogs. To all of our volunteer dog walkers — thank you. You truly make this work possible and actively enhance the lives of the dogs in our care.

Looking ahead, 2026 is shaping up to be busier than ever. The number of unclaimed and at-risk stray dogs continues to rise, and for many of these dogs the alternative is heartbreakingly final. These are healthy, loving animals who face destruction simply because they have nowhere else to go.

We will continue to step in where we are needed most — taking on these dogs others have let down, giving them safety, patience and expert care when they have nowhere else to turn. By doing so, we are not just offering shelter, but a second chance at life. Preventing the unnecessary loss of healthy dogs, which remains central to our mission, and with the continued support of you, our community, we will keep fighting for every dog that deserves a future.

UPDATE FROM THE CATTERY TEAM



As we look back on 2025, the cattery team has so much to be proud of. This year marked an incredible milestone for the sanctuary, with a record-breaking 596 cats and kittens rehomed into loving new homes. Each number represents a life changed — and a future made brighter.

A key part of this success was the opening of our new isolation building, which has transformed how we care for cats and kittens when they first arrive.

The facility allows us to safely accommodate unvaccinated animals and has added 11 additional pens, significantly increasing our capacity. This vital space has enabled us to welcome more vulnerable cats, give them the care they need, and ultimately help more of them find their forever homes.

OZZY

Among the many cats who came through our doors this year, one story that truly touched everyone was Ozzy's. Found alone on a quiet country road at just four weeks old, Ozzy arrived in our care facing significant challenges. On examination, it was discovered that he had been born without eyelids and required intensive treatment, including eye drops every few hours around the clock.



At first, Ozzy was understandably a little spicy — unsure of the world and wary of human hands. But once he realised he was safe and being helped, his true personality began to shine through. With time, patience and dedicated care, Ozzy thrived in foster care. As he grew, partial eyelids began to form naturally, and he has since undergone surgery to improve the surrounding tissue. He remains in foster while we continue to monitor his progress and assess whether any further procedures will be needed.

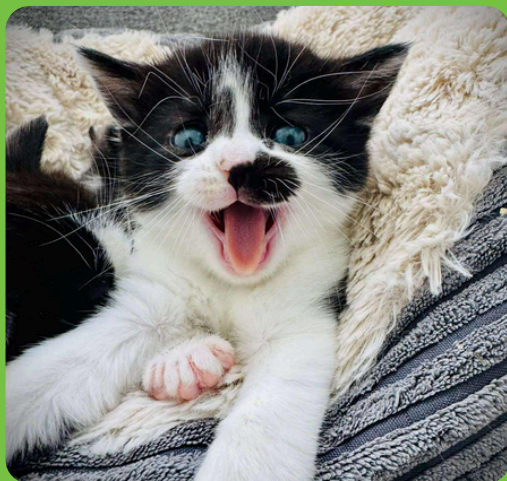

UPDATE FROM THE FARM TEAM



Within any animal rescue, there are moments of great joy alongside profound heartbreak. Autumn, a Clydesdale cross Thoroughbred mare, came into our care in September 2019 as part of a Phase One large-scale welfare rescue from Essex.

When she arrived, she was extremely underweight and deeply afraid of the world around her. Although she longed for connection and sought comfort from humans, her past experiences had left her overwhelmed by fear. Autumn was a beautiful, gentle, and sensitive soul who found reassurance within a small herd.

During her time with us, she bravely carried and gave birth to a beautiful filly, who has since gone on to a loving home. Over the years, we worked patiently and compassionately with Autumn, allowing her the time and space she needed to feel safe. While trust remained limited and she could only cope with a small number of familiar people, she made quiet progress at her own pace. Sadly, in June of 2025, Autumn suffered a severe bout of colic. Despite every effort, we were faced with the heartbreaking decision to let her go peacefully.

When Elvis first arrived at Thornberry Animal Sanctuary on 22nd October, he was just a little pony with very big fears. People frightened him so much that no one could get close enough to touch him, let alone catch him. His eyes were always wide, his body tense, ready to run at the smallest movement. For Elvis's own safety and welfare, the vet had to make a difficult but necessary decision. Elvis was carefully darted so he could be caught without anyone getting hurt — especially him. It wasn't an easy moment, but it was the first step toward a safer, kinder future.



What followed was not quick or simple. It took time, patience, and a lot of quiet understanding from the dedicated team and volunteers at Thornberry. No rushing. No pressure. Just gentle voices, calm presence, and trust built one small moment at a time. Slowly, Elvis began to change. The pony who once trembled at the sight of people started to stand a little closer. Then one day, he reached out to take food from a hand. Another day, he stayed still for a soft stroke. Each tiny step felt like a victory. Now, Elvis is almost unrecognisable from the frightened pony he once was. He loves kisses and cuddles, seeks out affection, and happily eats from our hands. His fear has been replaced with trust, and his world is brighter because of it.

Elvis reminds us that with rescued ponies, it's the little wins that lead to the biggest victories in the end — and every single one is worth celebrating.

UPDATE FROM THE SMALLS TEAM

2025, what a year!

This year marked a record-breaking year for our small animals, with 131 rabbits rehomed into loving homes. Alongside them, we also found families for 48 rats, 9 hamsters, 69 guinea pigs, 4 chinchillas and 8 other small furries, including gerbils and African soft furs. None of this would be possible without our incredible team of volunteers — thank you every single one of you.



A special thank you goes to our foster carers, whose support makes a huge difference, especially for rabbits needing extra time and care. One such bunny is Daisy, a little Dutch girl who underwent major surgery on site with our wonderful vet Gemma. Thanks to dedicated foster care, Daisy made a full recovery and is now thriving with her two rescue bunny friends.



Small animals — particularly rabbits — are often misunderstood. Looking back over 2025, we've seen time and again that once rabbits feel safe, secure and are given the right environment, their personalities are every bit as big as those of dogs and cats. We only wish more people could see just how special they are.

Sadly, we also dealt with heartbreaking cases of abandonment this year, including rabbits left boxed outdoors. We're extremely grateful to the members of the public who brought them into our care before harm could come to them — there is never an excuse to abandon an animal. We also welcomed several stray rabbits, including Mushroom, a small bun with a big personality, who went on to be adopted by one of our volunteers and is now living a happy, loved life.



Rabbits should never be kept alone. They are social animals and companionship is essential for their wellbeing, which is why every rabbit we rehome must have a bonded friend. Awareness and understanding of rabbit care continues to improve, and it's inspiring to see adopters eager to provide the right environments for rabbits and other small animals.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who supports our Smallies area — through volunteering, sharing our posts, donating, or supporting us in other ways. We were especially touched by the generosity shown over Christmas, with an outpouring of gifts, treats and supplies that ensured our small animals were not forgotten.

Providing enough space for small animals is absolutely crucial for their happiness and health.

That's why, as part of our adoption process, we have minimum enclosure size requirements:

- Hamsters / Mice: 100cm x 50cm
- Guinea Pigs: 150cm x 60cm
- Rabbits: 3 metres x 2 metres

The bigger the better! Daily time to roam and explore is also needed for rabbits and guinea pigs.



Did you know that wild rabbits can travel the equivalent of thirty football pitches a day?

Hutches, first designed in the early 1900s to fatten rabbits for food, were never intended as permanent living spaces and should only ever be used as hides, with doors left open. Space is absolutely vital — a rabbit living in a hutch alone is simply not living its best life.

For further guidance, the Rabbit Welfare Association also provides excellent advice on rabbit care and housing.

A SECOND CHANCE FOR ARCHIE



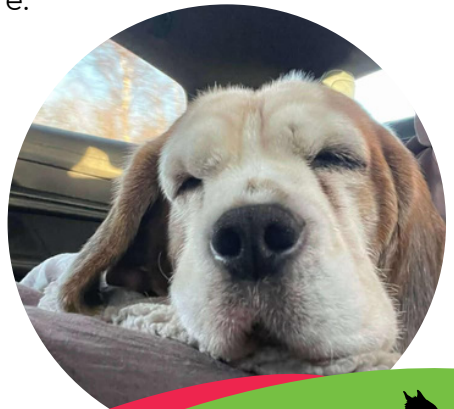

Despite everything he had endured, Archie remained affectionate and trusting. His ongoing medical needs, costing around £300 per month, made rehoming him a real challenge, so as Christmas approached we shared his story with the hope of giving him the comfort and care he deserved.

The response was extraordinary. Supporters pledged monthly donations and made generous one-off gifts, raising over £1,000 per month towards Archie's care.

Thanks to this incredible kindness, Archie's Christmas wish came true.

He found a loving forever home, with his new family also committed to covering his ongoing medical needs. Archie is now warm, comfortable, and surrounded by love — a powerful reminder of what our Thornberry community can achieve together.

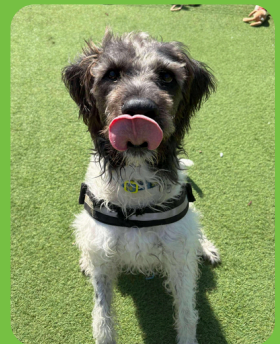

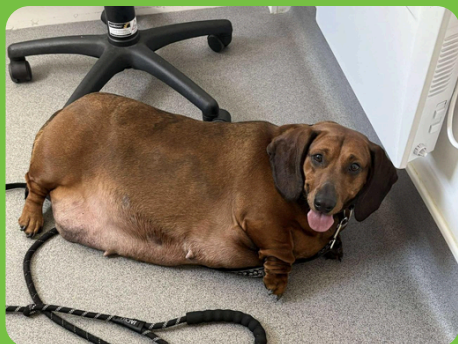
